There were a total of 1,604 "Participation Reward Credits" earned throughout last season, with 960 of them used.

This season we had FIVE (5) TOURNAMENTS held over 3 days. All were Double Elimination tourneys - totaling \$5,780, total payout during the event.

The DARTAHOLIC Award for this season went to ROGER PIACENTI who set a record of individual tournaments played (by a non-director) with 107 tournaments. That's unbelievable. All his efforts to improve his game have been worth it, as he doubled his Play/Place Ratio this season and has become 'A Contender'. Watch out for Roger. LOL >

Director's Notes:

This 13th DFW Dartistry season saw a downturn in player participation of about 30% as the economy with increased gas prices kept a lot of players from traveling too far from home to become qualified. We only had a total of 130 players who qualified and about 50% of them showed up throughout the weekend. This LOW participation percentage always confuses me. For why would someone take the time to QUALIFY for the EVENT and then NOT SHOW UP TO PLAY for at least ONE Tournament. Of course there will always be the unfortunate individuals that will be 'out of town'; 'have to work'; 'have family functions'; 'are sick' or 'broke'; but I can't see a reasonable excuse/reason for at least not having 70 ot 80%. After all, the EVENT IS PROMOTED for SIX MONTHS and is held in APRIL & OCTOBER every year. If you qualify for it, arrange your time accordingly.

We held two less events this season – NO SINGLES (regular or rated) because there have been too many complaints of 'sand-baggers' who ABUSED the 'Rating system' & the 'DQSL program' to keep their % low in order to play in a lower singles Division; AND that it was always the same people who were winning the Regular Singles and most of the qualified players didn't believe they could compete, so they stopped coming. The participation rate for each of these events kept spiraling downward every season, so WE ELIMINATED THEM. Instead we decided to MAKE ALL THE TOURNAMENTS BLIND-DRAWS, but different and varied type of formats.

We had192 total entries throughout the weekend; and the anticipated total to meet the \$7,000 Guarantee was 256. And I thought last season was down and that we could only go up. Guess I was wrong. This year, PSP did NOT payout what was promoted as a \$7,000 guarantee, because we did not meet the 64 player minimum per event (with Men's & Ladies' BD considered ONE event). We still kept the TOP finishing positions with a HIGHER PAYOUT than last season, but dropped the lower finishing positions. TOTAL PAID OUT FUNDS was \$7,110, (including \$350 in Chalker Prizes, plus \$960 in Side Pots).

We INCREASED THE PAYOUT for 1ST, 2ND, 3RD, & 4th PLACES (by 30% over last year) and only paid the TOP 4 to 8 teams (based on participation). We had been getting complaints that we paid out to far and therefore, the TOP finishing teams were not getting paid enough. Someone (usually those who lost just before the money or won in the lower finishing positions) always seem to whine and BLAME THE PAYOUT or THE PROGRAM for their losses and dissatisfaction. FRANKLY, I'M TIRED OF IT. Plus, they always complain to someone other THE TOURNAMENT DIRECTOR and WON'T PUT THESE THOUGHTS AND FEELINGS IN WRITING (as complaints and suggestions) WITH THEIR NAMES ON IT, instead they mumble and mope and use these excuses for not playing more or being unhappy. When in fact, it is their lousy throwing that kept them from the money (it was increased because we heard the MURRMURs and WHIMPERING after last season).

WE, the directors of The Circuit, and I, 'David Lloyd' Kuntze, (owner/manager/bookkeeper/website manager/director/salesperson/complaint department head/CEO/financial manager/personnel coordinator/advertising manager/publicity dept/etc. etc. etc.) TRY OUR BEST to make each of these EVENTS as FUN, PROFITABLE, and overall as ENJOYABLE as possible with the funds available and collected throughout each season. 90% of the FUNDS collected every season ARE PAID OUT in the tournaments to the finishing positions or as CHALKER PRIZES. The other 10% is used for Awards and Advertising (paper, ink, posters, flyers, gas and miscellaneous expenses) to PROMOTE and IMPLEMENT these season-end events every SIX MONTHS. Since, this is a FOR PROFIT business, I could (as ALL THE POKER SITES do) keep almost 20 to 30% of these funds; BUT I DON'T. It goes back to you, the players, in the best way possible – tournaments to play in and enjoy.

Please help us to LEARN WHAT YOU WANT; and WHEN YOU QUALIFY – COME OUT TO PLAY. Only when you play do I GET PAID by the SPONSORING CLUB, thereby making it worth my time (to some extent) to do this year after year. If you don't play – I don't get paid. Not your problem, right? YES! It is, because if it's not worth my time to plan, organize, prepare, implement, and direct, NOT ONLY will these season-end tournaments get smaller, but the nightly tournaments could and probably will disappear, as well. Just like so many of the sponsoring clubs have in the past. Then, what would you do?

I'm not trying to complain – just explain how CAUSE & EFFECT (the domino theory) works. I know that 'The Economy' and 'OUR government' are screwing with OUR livelihoods and making it harder and more difficult for of US to survive, let alone, have the discretionary

funds to go out and have a good time whether that be playing darts, drinking, fishing, movies, and more. However, it ONLY TAKES 64 PLAYERS to commit to playing ONCE A MONTH at EACH CURRENT SPONSORING CLUB (that averages to 16 players a week) and this WHOLE PROGRAM WORKS and CREATES FANTASTIC RESULTS for EVERONE. Last season we had a total of 487 different players. That averages out to enough players for SEVEN (7) nights a week and SEVEN (7) different clubs with a 16 player average every week. It works, but you have to work the plan. Some of the nightly tournaments could use your help and participation in order to keep them going. Keep playing.

The Billiard Den laid out very nice with plenty of room to move, as usual. We actually had 3 extra standards which kept the tournament moving steadily. I LOVED the layout. I liked being able to move around without bumping into someone's face especially behind the Director's area and the HIGH ceilings (*less smoke*). However, where the Dartistry will be held next time is still pending – feel free to put your input on 'The Forum'.

I didn't hear of any problems with SERVICE this season; and NO complaints about liquor or food prices. There were plenty of servers (probably too many from the wait staffs' point of view) and I felt 'The DEN' worked out very well again this season. The staff did an AWESOME JOB. Thank You LARRY, MARCY and all the waitresses, bartenders and other servers.

All in all it was a Fun tournament with fantastic competition, acceptable pay-outs, and lots of exciting darts thrown. Thanks everyone for playing, score keeping, and making this weekend so much FUN for ALL.

A special thanks goes to my co-directors (in NO particular order), Raylene Gleghorn, Candace Neal, Shannon Whyte, and of course my wife, Sara. The TEAM did a great JOB allowing each of us directors to enjoy playing in the tourneys, also. Thanks everyone.
